RE: Adoption of Digital Court Record as Official Court Record

The Court of Appeal for Saskatchewan would like to draw attention to its June 8, 2012 resolution relating to the official court record:

WHEREAS the Court stores all paper and electronic documents filed with it in digital form by electronic means in a way that preserves the integrity of those documents from the time the documents are filed with the Court;

AND WHEREAS this process results in a complete digital court record which is accessible so as to be usable for subsequent reference by any person who is entitled to have access to it;

AND WHEREAS the costs associated with storage, the long term viability and the searchability of a digital court record versus a paper court record all support moving from maintaining a paper court record to maintaining a digital court record;

NOW BE IT RESOLVED that the Court will hereafter maintain, as its official record, a digital court record only.

This resolution relates to the official court record for archival purposes and does not affect the number of paper copies that must be filed with the Court subsequent to electronic filing pursuant to *The Court of Appeal Rules* and the Court's practice directives.

In light of the foregoing, a person electronically filing documents with the Court must ensure that all documents necessary to an appeal, including correspondence, are electronically filed in their entirety so that a complete digital record is created for each appeal filed with the Court.
