### **Identification of Pronouns and Titles by Court Participants**

The Court of Queen's Bench for Saskatchewan strives to ensure that all parties who appear before it feel respected and heard. With that in mind, the Court invites parties, but does not require them, to identify the pronouns and titles they wish the Court to use.

Doing so will help the Court to avoid misgendering or otherwise misidentifying lawyers, parties, and other participants in the courtroom and in written decisions.

Examples of pronouns include, but are not limited to:

- She/her
- He/him
- They/them

Examples of titles include, but are not limited to:

- Ms.
- Mr.
- Mx.

Parties, lawyers and other participants may provide their pronouns and titles in advance by contacting the Registrar in writing, including by email. Alternatively, they are welcome to advise the Court Clerk of their pronouns and titles prior to the start of a hearing.

Counsel and self-represented parties are also invited to advise the Court of the pronouns and titles of other individuals attending court in relation to their matter, such as witnesses.

Informing the Court of pronouns and titles is optional; there is no obligation to do so.
